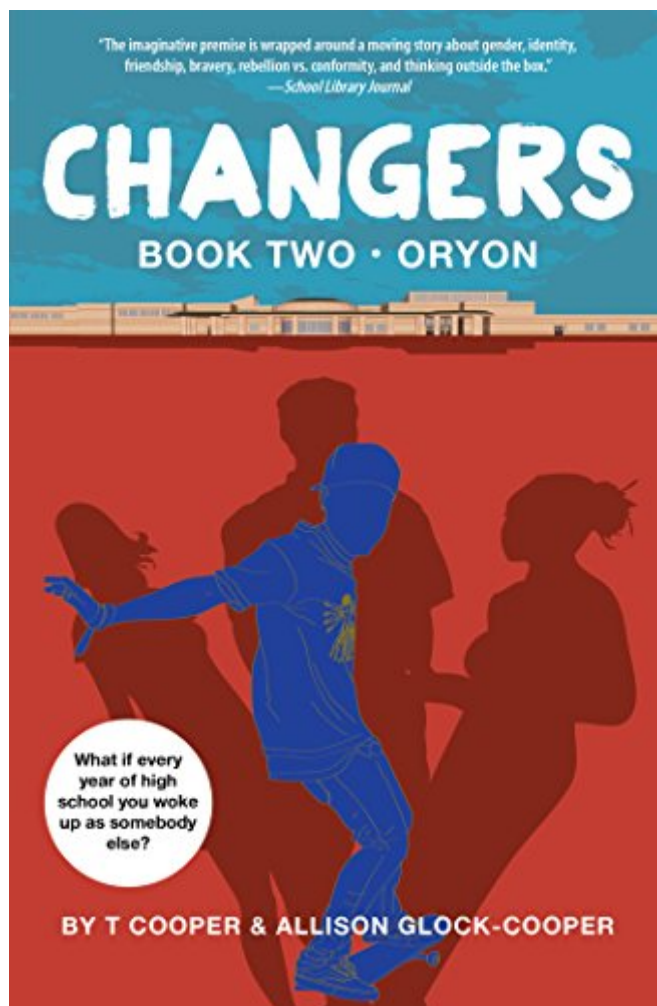


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Changers Book Two: Oryon

Enter a mess of trouble from the Changers Council, the closed-minded Abiders, the Radical Changers (RaChas), and his best friend Audrey--at least she was his best friend when Oryon was Drew--and now, it's complicated.But that's life (and life, and life, and life) for Changers, an ancient race of humans who must live out each year of high school as a completely different person. Before next summer, Oryon will learn what it means to be truly loved, scared spitless, and at the center of a burgeoning national culture war. Most of all, he will learn again how much the eyes of the world try to shape you into what they see--and how only when you resist do you clearly begin to see yourself.

In this second of the series, Ethan becomes Oryon, an African-American high school sophomore in the same small Tennessee town near Nashville. I thought being black in Tennessee seemed a bit soft-pedaled, but plot lines advance and characters develop. It's nice to see character development in a book for teens. This series shows how individual experience is affected by physical appearance, sex, behavior -- 'givens' that are not choices. The central character, the "changer", always is Ethan (Book One: Drew), and indicates that inner character and personality remain essentially the same, no matter in what shape a person appears.

I highly recommend this book, especially to those teens who don't like to read. Themes like sexuality, gender, race, and identity is what makes this book intriguing and relatable. I do think it's necessary to read Book One first so you can get more background and insight of what's going on. Most of the book deals with Oryon and Audrey's relationship, and there is an unexpected cliffhanger at the end. I'll definitely be reading Book 3 as soon as it comes out!

Everyone should read this series. Appropriate for middle school and up.

In this second novel, Ethan-now-Drew subsequently becomes Oryon, an athletic African-American boy and has to confront issues of racial discrimination as well as problems within the Changers Council and external forces hellbent on taking them down. Throughout, our intrepid protagonist doggedly continues to love the same fiercely intelligent girl. Will they get their HEA?
