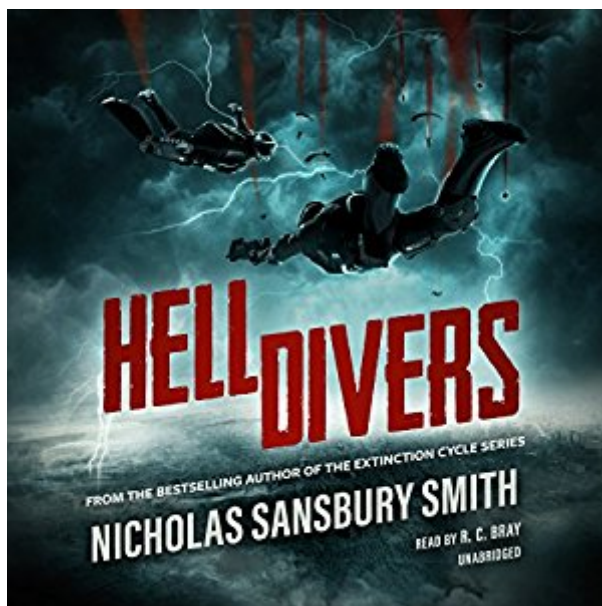

I enjoyed this book, but there were a couple of things here and there that caused me to question the plausibility of the story. Before I explain I will say that I generally do not read sci fi, fantasy, or apocalyptic fiction. I'm much more into spy/political thrillers or Christian literature. As for my questions, I wondered if the airships could really last for over 200 years in the air. Maybe they could, but it was a doubt that I had. I also wondered about there only being around 500 people on ship. It seems that everyone would know everyone in that situation - or at least know about everyone and be in everyone else's business. It seems that with a couple of thousand people it may be more likely that there would be the separation that is described in the book. Then again I could be completely

wrong and the author based his ideas on research. I definitely liked the concept and the overall story. The HDs reminded me of the Spartans in Halo. I will read the second book and see if any of my questions are answered. I commend the author on his works. I'm interested in reading some of his other books/series.

There are only two left in the world. Large flying war machines that are part helium airship and, hover craft with the ability to fly and they are powered with nuclear power packs. They are hundreds of years old and they survived through the efforts of the hell divers. The brave men and women that are shot out of the craft to dive down to the war torn and demolished Earth to find the parts necessary to repair the craft and keep them flying. The two craft contain all of the remaining living human beings on earth. One of the ships is catastrophically damaged by a storm and the hell divers they send down are all dead but one. They are killed by falling through the massive storms or from being attacked by the mutant monsters that roam the earth and fly in the sky. The aircraft named "The Hive" gets the distress call and rushes to try to help rescue their sister craft. Can they arrive in time to save half the human race or will they meet with disaster also? I am a huge fan of the author Nicholas Smith. I have read all of his series of books of the Extinction series and enjoyed them all. This book, Hell Divers, is the first book of a new series.
