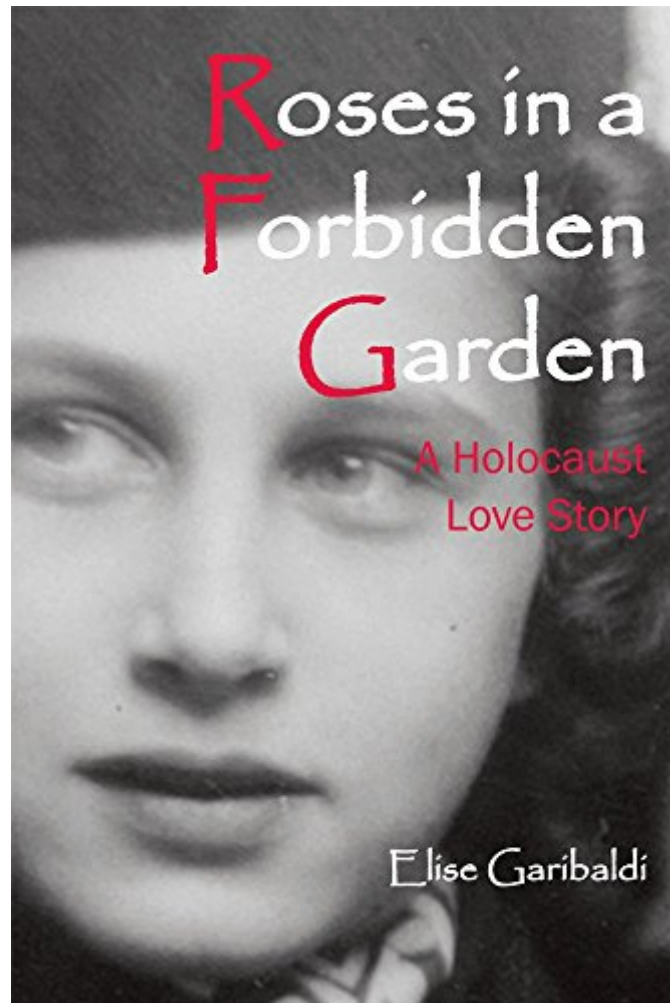

Elise Garibaldi has lovingly recreated the world of her grandmother, beautiful Inge Katz, a Jewish girl who, along with her family, is thrust into the horrors of Nazi Germany. Guiding the reader through Inge's life from 1938 - 1947, "Roses in a Forbidden Garden" recounts the horrors of the Holocaust, yet the book glows with the love story of Inge and Schmuël that unfolds miraculously against impossible odds. Inge is only 14 in 1938 when she lived through the horror of Kristallnacht,

the night Hitler's henchmen smashed Jewish homes and businesses and took men away from their families. The fact that Inge's father Carl was a decorated veteran of WWI and a respected business owner did not exempt his family from the destruction. The Nazis subjected Jews in Germany (and countries conquered by Germany) to increasing atrocities, resulting in horrific suffering and, for countless numbers of Jews, loss of their lives. The reader accompanies Inge and her parents through the increasing dangers for Jews in their hometown of Bremen, Germany. The reader follows Inge in 1942 when the Katz family was sent to the Theresienstadt concentration camp. In the worst possible situations, threatened by starvation, disease and Nazi oppression, Inge always finds a way to be useful and to help her parents and others. In each horrific situation, the reader is enlightened by Inge's insights that there is always hope for the future. There were 40,000 Jews crowded into Theresienstadt. During prayer services in the concentration camp on the night of Yom Kippur, Inge first saw Schmuel, a handsome young man from Czechoslovakia. The Nazis had assigned Inge to forced labor in a factory, and Schmuel was assigned to labor in the bakery. Amid the horrors of concentration camp labor, Inge and Schmuel form a deep romantic attachment and hope for a future together. Inge and Schmuel are cruelly separated in 1944 when he is transported east to a death camp. Inge's love for Schmuel carries her forward with a strong will to survive; Schmuel was Inge's beacon of light and hope. E.G.'s narrative illuminates small moments that are unforgettable, and the book includes evocative photos of Inge, her parents, and Schmuel, as well as chilling scenes from the concentration camps. This book is a valuable history lesson, a great love story, and an inspiration that faith and hope can create an indomitable will to survive.
