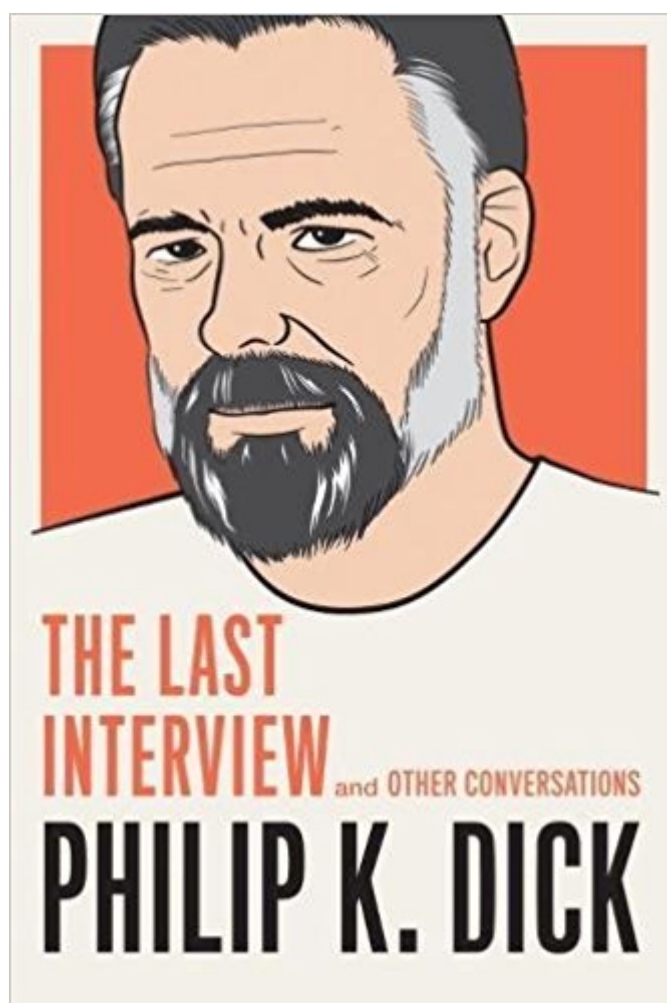

PHILIP K. DICK (b. 1928, Chicago, IL; d. 1982, Santa Ana, CA) was a writer of science fiction who published 45 novels and 121 short stories over the course of his lifetime. Much of his work has been adapted to film, notably *Do Androids Dream of Electric Sleep?* (which became "Blade Runner"), *Total Recall*, *Minority Report* and *A Scanner Darkly*. Dick was the recipient of a Hugo Award in 1963 and 1974, and was inducted into the Science Fiction Hall of Fame in 2005; in 2007, he became the first science fiction writer to be included in the Library of America Series. His work has been translated into more than 25 languages. Editor David Streitfeld is a Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist who writes for *The New York Times*. He was the editor of *Gabriel García*

Márquez: The Last Interview and Philip K. Dick: The Last Interview.

You can literally feel when an episode of mental illness is coming on, sometimes sparked by a question. Complex man and complex ideas--maybe that is why I have been reading PKD for over 35 years and have never grown old of his work. His work is speculative, and addresses honestly many of the questions we wrestle with in our day to day lives. The human condition. Though most of his work is sci-fi, his ideas are timeless and probing. Sometimes, most of the time, giving us some of the answers we might not really want to know.
