

Although it doesn't say it in the description, many of the reviews make it sound like this book is part of the "No Fear Shakespeare" series which includes the Shakespearean text with a side by side comparison of modern English. This is not the case. It's a perfectly good edition if you're looking for just the plain text of King Lear, but it isn't a "No Fear Shakespeare" book.

This was a savior for me in class. Seriously, if you have any trouble understanding what is even going on in any Shakespeare play (I had a lot of trouble), buy this. It is a miracle inside of book. One side of the page has the actual text and the other side basically translates it into more modern English.

I would have been totally confused when I went to see the play if I had not been able to read in modern English beforehand. So, I loved it!!

I belong to a Shakespeare club that reviews a different play each year. This year it is King Lear. I find using the No Fear series much easier to understand. One year I bought a different playbook and was not happy with it so returned to No Fear.
