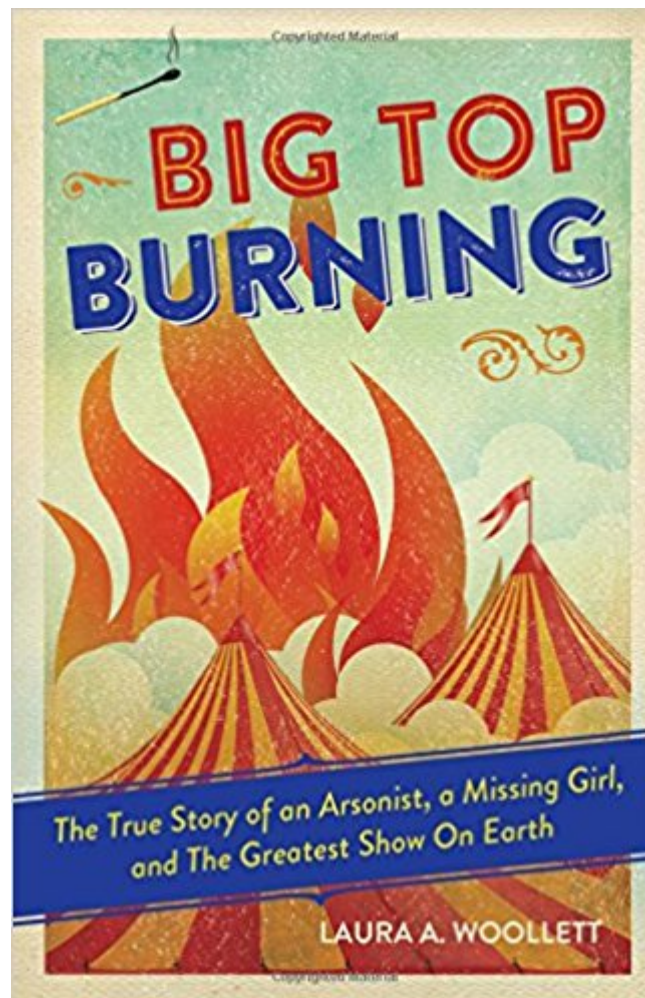




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Big Top Burning: The True Story Of An Arsonist, A Missing Girl, And The Greatest Show On Earth



Synopsis

On July 6, 1944, thousands of fans made their way to Barbour Street in Hartford, Connecticut, to see the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus performance. Not long after the showâ€™s start, a fire broke out and spread rapidly as panicked circus-goers pushed and scrambled to escape. Within 10 minutes the entire big top had burned to the ground, and 167 people never went home. *Big Top Burning* recounts the true story of one of the worst fire disasters in US history. It follows the tragic stories of the Cook familyâ”including children Donald, Eleanor, and Edward, who were in the audience that dayâ”and 15-year-old Robert Segee, a circus employee with an incendiary past. Drawing on primary sources and interviews with survivors, author Laura Woollett guides readers through several decades of investigations and asks, Was the unidentified body of a little girl nicknamed âœLittle Miss 1565â• Eleanor Cook? Was the fire itself an act of arsonâ”and did Robert Segee set it? Young readers are invited to evaluate the evidence and draw their own conclusions. *Combining a gripping disaster story, an ongoing detective and forensics saga, and vivid details about life in World War IIâ”era America, Big Top Burning is sure to intrigue any history or real-life mystery fan.*

Gr 5â”8â”The Hartford, CT, circus fire of 1944 is still infamous locally for killing 167 people and injuring more in only 10 minutes. Woollett's retelling of the event is interspersed with

thought-provoking questions designed to encourage readers to ponder the gaps in our knowledge about the event ("So what about the city of Hartford? Did it have a role in not preventing the disaster?"). The story of the actual fire is gripping, but the narrative is occasionally on the dry side, and the pace slows as the book goes into more detail covering the arson investigation and the identification of the victims. The inclusion of photos and documents adds appeal, though, and students learning about forensics may be interested in the investigation processes. This book has all the excitement you would associate with an event like this, yet manages to avoid the tone that could be somewhat offputting to many young (and older) readers. Woollett has carefully researched this event and traces the story and the investigation in great detail; she also does a great job of placing it in its historical context. Some of the facts just blew me away. The fact that flammable liquids were used to waterproof a tent, the lack of inspection, etc. Wow! The

well-chosen (and never grisly) photographs really help young readers to imagine what this world looked like in times past. I would recommend this to any young reader who likes history, is interested in circuses, or in investigation.

A good account of the circus fire, but not the best.

I had never heard of the big fire that destroyed a Ringling Bros. Barnum & Bailey Circus tent in 1944 in Hartford, Connecticut before reading *BIG TOP BURNING* by Laura A. Woollett. The fire, which destroyed the tent in less than 10 minutes, killed 167 people and injured dozens more. It made headlines across the country. Woollett sifted through police reports, newspaper articles, interviews and eye witness accounts searching for information about this tragic fire. The official report says the cause of the fire was undetermined. After following all the events in the book, the reader is left to decide for himself if the fire was arson or accidental. There is a secondary storyline/mystery in the text --- was the unidentified remains of a little girl found after the fire actually Eleanor Cook? Cook disappeared after the circus and was never found. In 1991, the town of Hartford put up a memorial

in honor of Eleanor, believing the remains to be hers, but not everyone is convinced. No matter your opinions or conclusions about the fire and the mystery of the missing girl, you will have to agree that the author did a thorough job of researching these historical events. She includes quotes from eye witnesses, and the back matter includes extensive Notes and a Bibliography. There are also plenty of photos scattered throughout the pages. If history is your thing, then this is a good book for you to read. If mysteries and who-dun-its are your thing, then you'll enjoy this book for that reason, too.
