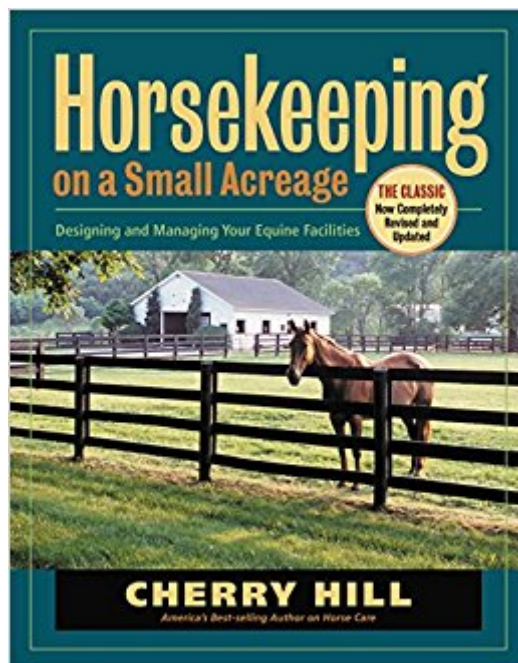




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Horsekeeping On A Small Acreage: Designing And Managing Your Equine Facilities

I’ve been keeping horses for 35 years in a variety of circumstances - boarding, large open ranch with hundreds of acres, smaller farm set up, and on an urban lot. We just purchased a place with 7 acres in town that requires the horse facilities be built from scratch. This book has definitely helped me figure out the best layout for multiple, rotational paddocks. Mostly though, it has been useful in figuring out how to best protect the existing spring fed creek from unintended waste runoff. I would suggest all horse owners read this and especially the first timers. It’s easier & less expensive to set up your place correctly at the start rather than fix big problems later.

This book is really helpful in setting up a small horse facility. We are starting from scratch, and it gives us a lot of ideas. My favorite part is the sample layouts, although I think those could use more description about why they were set up that way and alternatives.

Even tho I gave it an excellent book I must qualify that with the fact that I no experience whatsoever with keeping any animal other than a cat or a dog on a subdivision lot. However, the book is very

well organized and very specific. It explains in detail what it means to own an animal like a horse and even explains how to keep financial records which is not something I had even contemplated. Also there are legal ramifications that I had no knowledge of at the onset of my study until reading this book. This is not all, the book not only explains what type of site for keeping your horse is going to work for you personally and ideally for your horse. I thoroughly enjoyed all the color photos of housing, land, horses and examples of working farms already established and example blueprints for your own to design and build. The book gave examples of equipment necessary for keeping, caring for and transporting your horse. Much detail was put into the land management for your property where the horse will be grazing and running and living. Soil samples, hay types and even noxious weeds are discussed. Water quality and had a whole chapter devoted to it! Excellent book!

A really satisfying book to have in your hands; glossy, thick, quality, heavy. Everything I was expecting and probably more. I have recently leased eight acres of land to graze my two horses on, and I am learning as I go at how to best manage that land. I am considering it practice as we save up for our own 3-5 acre property. With that in mind, I purchased this book to get advice from someone experienced with managing smaller properties. The content within this book is better than I imagined. It has everything from budget templates, sample costing, barn diagrams and layouts, beautiful huge colour pictures with captions and descriptions, easy to read text written in a way that anyone can understand. My personal favorites are the sample land layouts; they provide a before and after diagram of what a property looks like (for example eight acres with just a house and garage on it), and then it proposes the changes to best suit that property (where paddocks could be fenced, gravel paths or driveways laid, a barn or stables placed, an arena, etc) to best utilise that particular land. It offers several different types, all displaying ways to use each property to their best advantage. This book is a pot of gold! Some things are total common sense about horse keeping, and others are little nuggets that I hadn't even thought of but that make so much sense. If you even get just a handful of ideas out of this book, it is still worth the purchase, and it's a real page turner. When I got it, I couldn't stop turning the pages. The pictures are stunning, they offer solutions for properties in winter when controlling mud or snow, and they offer solutions for just about anything you need to know about keeping horses, whether they be in pasture full time, or in stables, or in yards. The author has tried to include everything her knowledge base has given her, and it is much

more than I ever expected or I had even thought about. An extremely good buy, even for those just dreaming of having a property later in life, it is great to skim through and imagine all the possibilities :o)
